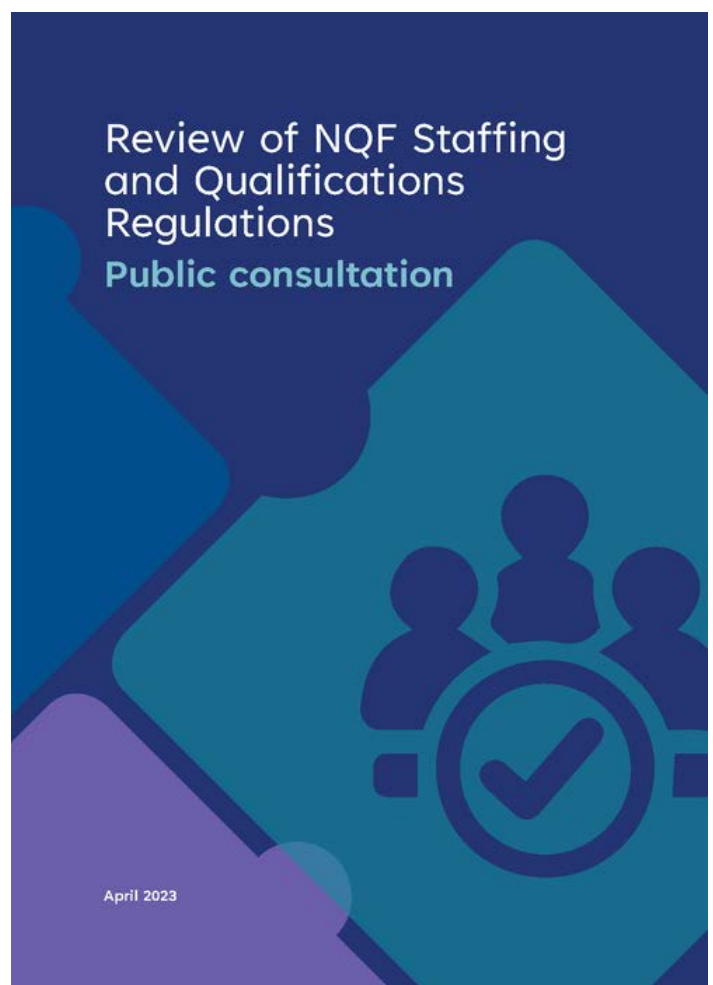

Elonera Montessori School's Collaboration with the University of Wollongong

Elonera Montessori School (EMS) is an independent, co-educational environment currently catering for children from 12 months of age to 18 years of age

In 2021, due to space constraints at Elonera, we inquired at our local university, the University of Wollongong, regarding teaching spaces. We negotiated two classroom spaces and were also given the opportunity to book other rooms and resources across the university at no extra cost.

We now teach there between two and three days per week, giving the students the run of the campus during their free time to utilise the library, coffee shops, cafes and study spaces. With my subjects, biology and chemistry we have struck up relationships with the lab technicians who have provided us with a number of practical activities that we would be unable to provide otherwise.

The students have loved working with and being at UoW and comment on how it has reduced their anxiety around participating in tertiary education; in effect, they already are, as they use the spaces and meet both staff and students.

Moving offsite has allowed the students to work independently of the High School, it has created a sense of separateness and allowed the students to begin to transition to tertiary education whilst maintaining their ties with our Montessori community.

It's not without its difficulties. Staff and students have to travel between sites and sometimes there are logistical bumps, but it's an avenue well worth exploring, with additional benefits, if your school is looking to expand.

Montessori Introduced at the Burnett Youth Learning Centre

October 2022 saw Burnett Youth Learning Centre (BYLC) tap into the treasure of the Montessori Method in a quest to better understand its framework and explore the possibility of adopting a fresh perspective for meeting student needs.

BYLC is a registered Special Assistance School (SAS) situated on a 28-hectare farm just south of Bundaberg, Queensland. The school was established in January 2007 with a class of 6 students as a Christian response to a local need, supporting young people who had disengaged or were at risk of disengaging from mainstream education. This foundation remains the cornerstone for enrolment.

Since the first day of operation, students have been provided with the chance to learn in a supportive, alternative education setting that acknowledges and emphasises the unique God-given value, goals and dreams of each individual. In more recent times, the school has seen a growing need for the inclusion of younger students in the program, keen to get their hands dirty with practical learning experiences 'down on the farm'. The need to balance Australian Curriculum with practical skills to establish stepping stones for senior schooling, employment or further study has provided an opportunity to stretch and challenge students as they navigate their learning journeys.

Currently, BYLC hosts approximately 80 students, most of whom selected enrolment on the basis that teaching and learning would occur through practical application of curriculum content, having come with poor self-concept as capable learners. Through perseverance and targeted teaching, most students elect vocational education and training options in senior, confident in their ability to learn.

Celebrating student success of placement in the workforce and at university, in January 2023 the staff at BYLC embarked on a learning journey of their own to discover the hidden treasures of Montessori pedagogy and strengthen their practice to better equip students in this space. Through this learning, it became apparent that the Montessori Method would be a good fit for BYLC; however, there is still much work to do as a teaching team to bring students on the journey to self-discovery. Interestingly, despite negative experiences and fixed mindsets, there is security in the familiar for this cohort, so the challenge for the team is to maximise project-based learning to foster inquiry and a love of learning. The staff team is excited to see where this training leads.

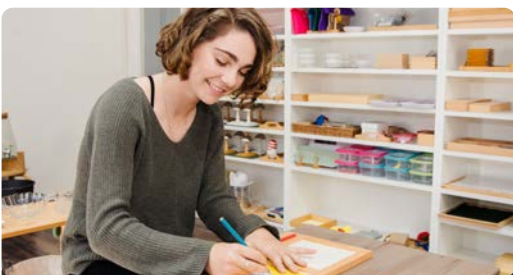
