COURSE TITLE	Diploma of Montessori Leadership and Practice		
COURSE DESCRIPTION	The <i>Diploma of Montessori Leadership and Practice</i> offers Heads of Schools, Directors or others in leadership positions in Montessori schools or centres, the opportunity to gain a generalist understanding of Montessori principles and practices and further develop their leadership skills. The units in this non-award Diploma have been selected to provide candidates with a broad and relevant base of knowledge for their employment or for further study.		
COURSE DELIVERY	The Diploma Course is studied over a period of one year to a maximum of three years. Candidates will examine the challenges of providing quality pedagogy while developing leadership capabilities relevant to the Montessori context. The Units assist candidates to acquire knowledge and understanding of the Montessori approach across the range of ages. However, for specific Montessori knowledge, candidates choose two curriculum areas to study in more depth. The first section of the course includes Montessori theory, leadership skills, governance and other related topics. The second section covers practical issues and Montessori curriculum.		
QUALIFICATION ENTRY	Teacher Registration or relevant professional experience.		
COURSE STRUCTURE	The Course is studied over a period of one year to a maximum of three years and is divided into: • Seven Units which includes twenty assignments • At least four Intensive Block Workshops (minimum of ten days) Approximate study times for the various aspects of the Diploma Course are: • Units and assignments • Workshops and Observations 160 hrs. TOTAL – 560 hours nominal		
CREDIT FOR PRIOR LEARNING	The Montessori Institute is committed to recognising previous studies and other relevant prior learning that contributes towards satisfying requirements for its courses. Credit for Prior Learning (CPL) is an integral part of our service and everyone is entitled to apply. Applicants will be advised of the cost of tuition fees and further work to be completed.
