



MONTESSORI AUSTRALIA NATIONAL SUMMIT, ULURU SPEAKERS



VANESSA AIKINS has been an administrator in the Western Australian secondary government school sector since 1999. Her roles have included deputy principal in two regional schools, associate principal in three large government secondary schools, principal of an Education Support Centre and Curriculum Development Officer in a metropolitan regional office for the Department of Education. In 2010 Vanessa undertook the role of principal of Rockingham Montessori School and she proudly commenced the Adolescent Program for the school in 2012. Vanessa completed the AMI Montessori Orientation Program to Adolescent Studies (12-18) with NAMTA in 2013.



KAREN BENNETTS has been involved in the Australian Montessori community for over 20 years. She was a founding principal of a Montessori school for ten years and taught 6-12 children for eight years. Karen has completed the AMI 3-6 Diploma, the AMI Orientation to Adolescent Studies as well as two Montessori Diplomas covering the early childhood and primary years from MWEI. Karen is currently completing her PhD in Montessori Leadership at Monash University. She has three children who all attended Montessori programs. Karen is developing MAF's new Montessori Independent Schools division, and also coordinates MAF's publications.



BILL CONWAY has been in the field of education for over 30 years. His career path within education has included roles in teaching, counselling, and administration within schools in the US, Colombia, New Zealand and Australia. He became interested in school reform early in his career, working on programs which enhanced children's self-awareness and personal development. His work in South America led to a focus on bilingual education and the need to respond to the needs of children from varied cultural backgrounds. Finding Montessori education symbolised for him the most significant discovery and most precious regard for children's education and development. He has been the head of school at Montessori East in Bondi since 2007.



CATHY FRANCE has worked at The Hills Montessori School in the Adelaide Hills since 1994. Prior to working in Montessori education Cathy worked in city and country/public and independent schools in South Australia and also spent four years teaching in London UK. Cathy worked in the Cycle 3 classroom at The Hills Montessori School for 10 years and for seven of those years was also assistant principal. In 2004 Cathy became principal and during her time as principal has established an Infant Program and an Adolescent program located at a second campus.



STEVEN GOULD is a competent, inspirational and professional facilitator. Initially from a Human Resource background, he has facilitated a wide range of seminars focused around leadership, people management, strategic business, organisation change and futures studies. He has partnered, consulted and delivered seminars/symposium/workshop/lectures on a range of futures studies initiatives covering diverse applications in both public and private industry sectors. A member of the Association of Professional Futurist and a full institutional member of the World Futures Studies Federation, Steve is currently undertaking his doctoral studies (PhD) at the University of the Sunshine Coast with his thesis titled "Strategic Foresight Leadership: Critical Elements". Steve currently lectures at the University of the Sunshine Coast where he developed and co-ordinates the "Futures Research Methods & Techniques" (FUT710) and "Strategic Foresight Leadership" (FUT720) courses.



CHRISTINE HARRISON has been involved in Montessori education since 1985 and was principal of the Canberra Montessori School, one of the largest Montessori schools in Australia, for over ten years. She is the founding Chair of Montessori Australia and was Chair of the Association of Independent Schools in the ACT and on the Board of the Independent Schools Council of Australia. Christine has been involved in policy development, compliance, student care, curriculum development and educational leadership in schools and has a background in mediation, conflict resolution, adult education and a particular interest in governance in community organisations.

With a professional background in computers, finance and marketing she has assisted numerous Montessori associations both in Australia and overseas. She is currently Executive Director of the Montessori Children's Foundation and Montessori Australia, CEO of the Australian Centre for Montessori Studies and Project Manager for the Association Montessori Internationale.



ANTHONY VANDERMOLEN has developed his career in education through a range of roles including, Teacher of English, Physical Education and Sciences, as well as senior roles in Learning Support and Guidance & Counselling, before transitioning into School Leadership.
